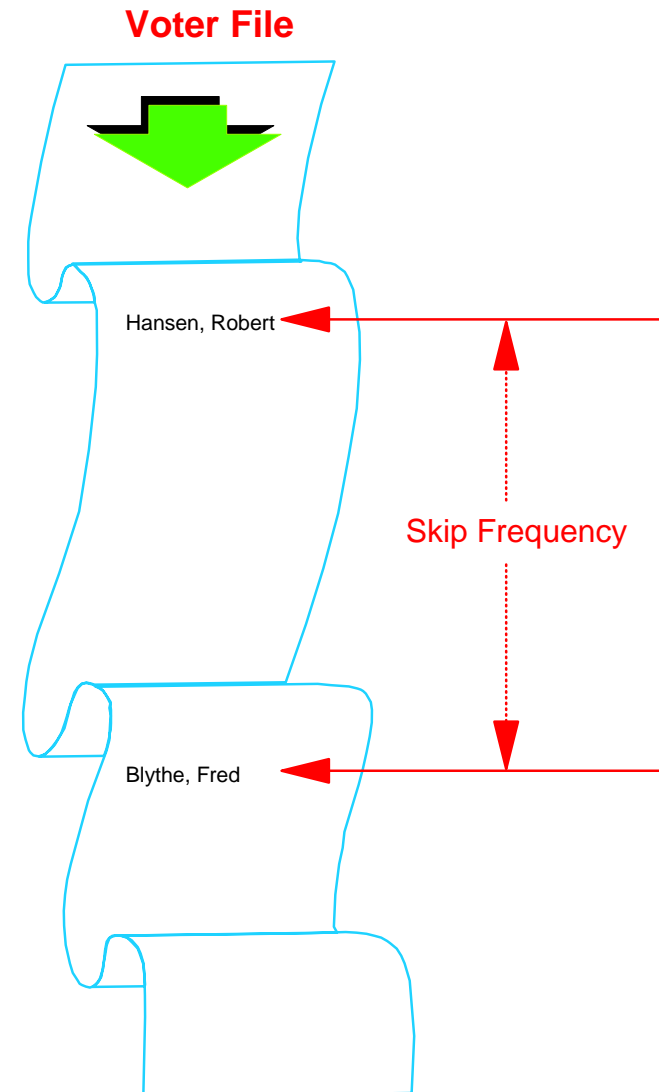
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VCS Stratified Random Samples

VCS produces stratified random samples from voter files for use in a variety of campaign situations, generally for polling but occasionally for other uses. Our voter files are maintained in "geographic" sequence, which means they are sorted first by county, then precinct, then street name, then street number, then apartment number, then alphabetically by name. Most stratified samples are extracted in this sequence. First a "skip frequency" is picked by dividing the number of desired sample points into the total voter base. Then a "starting" number is picked at random between zero and the skip frequency. A counter is set to the "starting" number and then counted up one for every voter as the file is passed. When the counter equals the "skip frequency", a "sample point" is determined and the counter is reset to zero, to begin counting again. This is repeated over and over again until the entire file has been passed. It is possible to first sort the voter file into some different order to provide more complicated stratifications, but this is more expensive and very rare in practice.

Generally a random sample can be extracted from the voter file and then converted to any regular product. It is possible to produce magnetic tapes, PC diskettes, computer letters, 3x5 cards, etc.. Most random samples are still printed as some format of voter list, but each year more and more are ordered on magnetic media for automatic phone dialing systems.

In the simplest form of random sample, shown in the **R1) SIMPLE STRATIFIED SAMPLE** page, a single voter is selected at each "sample point".



R1) SIMPLE STRATIFIED SAMPLE

It is printed as a standard Selective Voter List.

Precinct has been printed to the right of city-state-zip. You could also request voter flags, voter ID number, or some canvass codes printed in this space. Precinct can be useful since otherwise it prints only at the top of the page.

Political Party, Birth Date and Registration Date can still be printed in this area.

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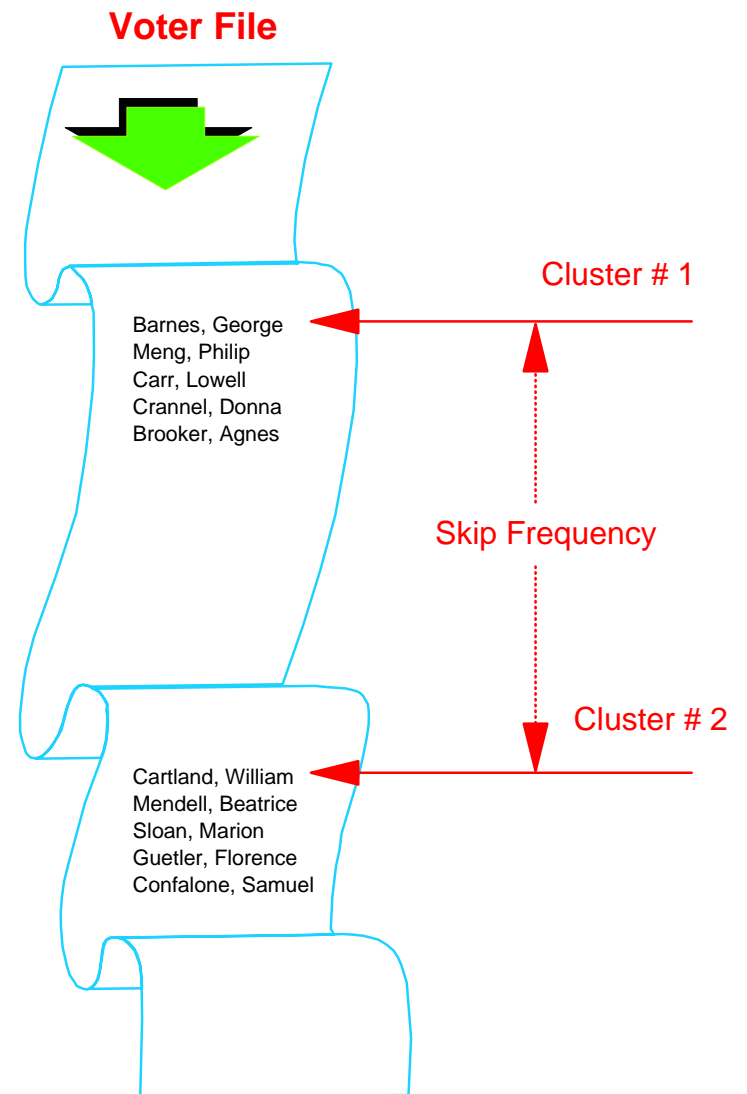

VCS Clustered Sample System

Most of the samples we sell are 'clustered' samples. This involves the same process of stratified selection as simple nth samples, but at each "sample point" a "cluster of m voters" is selected. Generally the first voter from each succeeding household is selected to fill out the cluster, although several other possibilities will be discussed later.

The major idea of clustering is to control the "oversample" so that the people actually reached in the survey still maintain some level of homogeneity throughout the area being sampled. In the regular "nth voter" sample, for instance, it is typical to pick between three and ten times as many voters as you actually need because you know -- for a variety of reasons -- that you won't be able to reach every voter picked in the sample. The problem then is controlling the interview selection so that respondents don't come disproportionately from a few geographic areas. This could happen just because the callers started at the top of the list or just because people in certain areas are more likely to be home when you are calling because of the demographics of the area. Because the clusters are spread homogeneously over the district, reaching exactly one respondent in each cluster assures that the respondents are likewise spread homogeneously over the district.

To do a cluster sample, you order a few more clusters than you want completed interviews. If you want 600 completed interviews, you might order 610 clusters. You then calculate the skip frequency to provide this many sample points. You determine the number of voters selected in each cluster based on how many people you estimate you will need in order to be sure of completing one interview within every cluster. Two examples of simple cluster samples are shown in the **R2) CLUSTER OF 5 SAMPLE** and the **R3) CLUSTER OF 10 SAMPLE** pages.

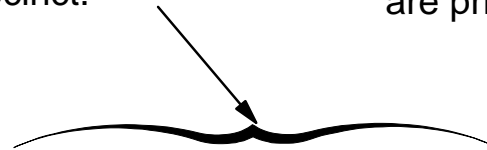
R3) CLUSTER OF 10 SAMPLE

City and State have been dropped so that voter flags and major jurisdiction codes can be printed. These can be useful since otherwise they print only at the top of the page, like precinct.

Political Party, Age and Registration Date are printed in this area.

VCS Provides Phone Connections

Most modern political polling is conducted via telephone. Occasionally random samples are ordered for use through the mail or by walking, but the vast majority are for phoning. Making the right phone connections is the basic purpose of a random sample.

VCS starts by matching its voter files with an up-to-date national telephone directory. Numbers that are provided on the voter file are preserved, but where ever possible they are verified by match against the national phone file. Local files don't always carry area code, but VCS adds area codes and makes them available on samples. Using this process, VCS has telephone numbers for about 63% of its national file of registered voters.

It is very important to count all voters when picking a sample, whether they have phones or not. Counting only those with phones can easily skew a sample towards more stable areas or areas that simply have cleaner addressing structure. At the same time, there is no reason to fill up a cluster with people who don't have phones, even trying to look them up rarely yields results.

VCS has developed the perfect solution to this dilemma, the Pure Phone Cluster. As the voter file is passed, all voters are counted until the skip frequency is reached and it is time to start selecting a cluster. From that point on, only households with phones are selected for inclusion in the cluster. This means every voter in the cluster will have a phone, but the sample will be spread homogeneously over the district based on total voters. A perfect solution to maximum phone connections with minimal fuss! The next page shows **R4) PURE PHONE CLUSTERS OF 10.**

The idea of "pure clusters" can be extended to things like Party or Gender, to give higher levels of controlled homogeneity. Not only can you be sure that respondents are spread uniformly over the district, you can also be sure to get a certain number of R's, D's or I's; Men or Women. One example of such a sample is shown on **R5) PURE PHONE/PARTY/GENDER CLUSTERS OF 10.**

With Pure Phone Clusters a phone number is printed for every voter on the page. Because the skip is done over all voters, however, the sample is not skewed towards areas with high phone matches.

Response codes have replaced City-State-Zip, Precinct and District Codes. Response codes help interviewers keep track of which numbers have been tried and what happened.

Voter Flags, Political Party, Birth Date and Registration Date are Printed in this area.

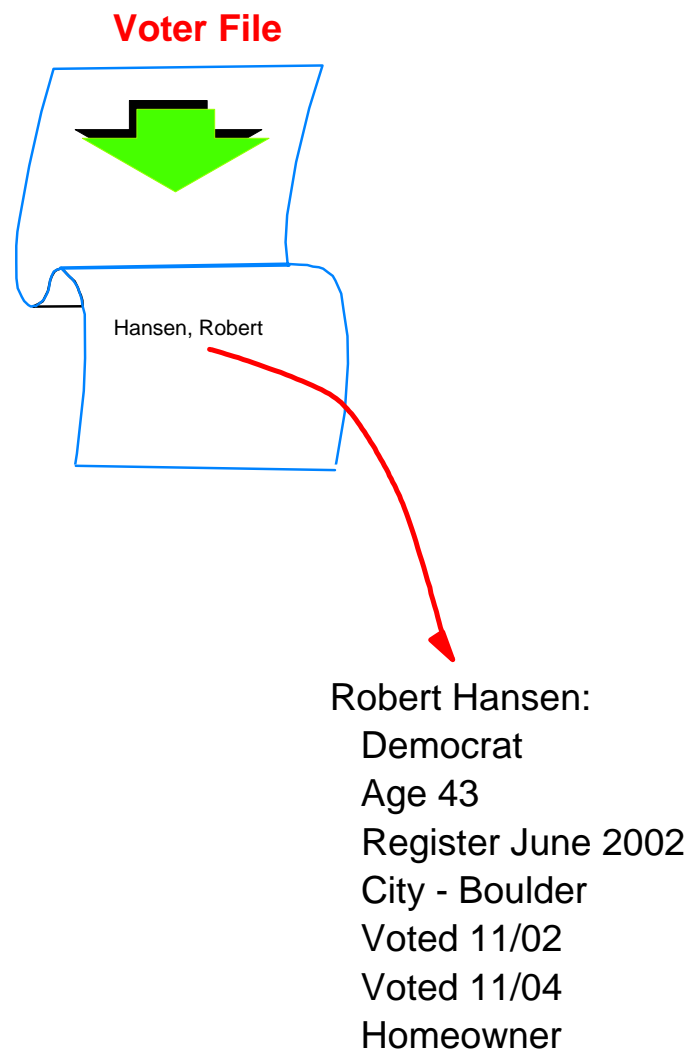
You Can Capture Individual Voter Data

One of the big advantages of registered voter based samples is the large amount of specific information available on each individual voter. We have focused so far on the critical information about which voters actually live in your district, and nothing can be more important. There is little value in surveying people who can't vote, either because they live outside the district or because they aren't registered. But there may be a wealth of other data available on each voter.

You can always ask people for this information while you are interviewing them, but that takes time -- therefore costs money. It may prevent you from being able to use that time to ask other valuable questions. And we all know that sometimes they don't tell the truth about their ages. Picking up information that is available on the voter file avoids these problems.

If you order a sample on magnetic media, it is easier to get all available data; but with printed lists the space for data may be limited. In the earlier samples of voter lists, we showed several different options for data printed on the list. The most popular are shown in samples R3 and R4. These provide some commonly used data elements, but still omit quite a lot of individual voter data. For maximum data availability, we recommend our EXTENDED INFORMATION LIST. This list is slightly more expensive than the single line SELECTIVE VOTER LIST, but the file pass charge is typically the largest cost of a sample, and that doesn't change.

The basic version of this list is shown in the next list, **R6) EXTENDED INFORMATION LIST, 21 FLAGS**. Note that this list also prints the area code for every household, which can be important in some areas.



R6) EXTENDED INFORMATION LIST, 21 FLAGS

With the Extended Information List you can have the maximum data available for each voter printed. These are the only lists that provide all 21 flags and area code for every household. All other data plus response codes are also available.

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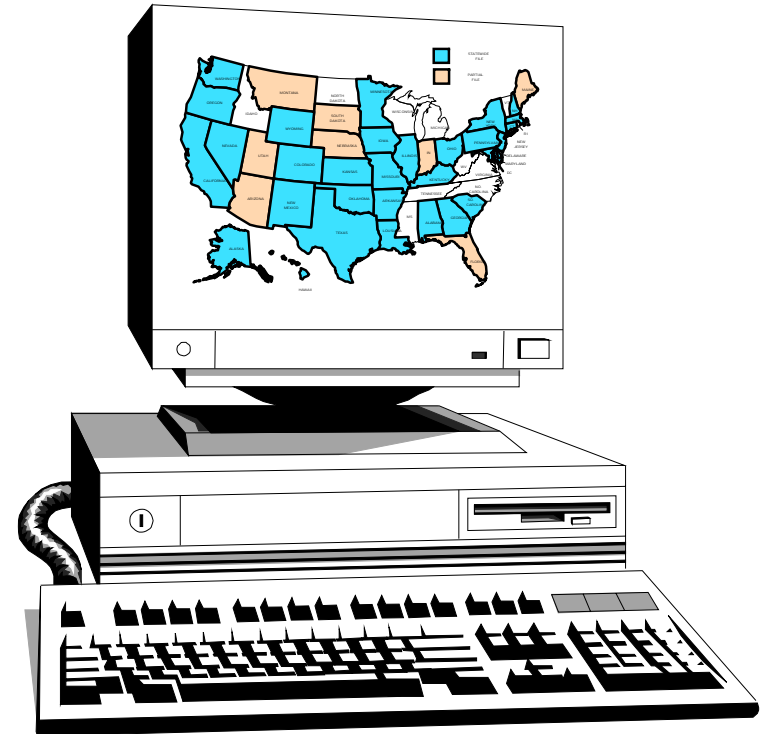
What Detailed Information Is Available?

The exact information on a voter file varies a lot from place to place. VCS has developed its **National Political Data Base** in order to make it quick and easy to understand what is available on the voter file you are interested in. A set of Voter File Information reports gives a quick reference on what data is available for every voter file in the VCS system. The STATS93 portion of the system provides detailed counts on exactly how many people in the area in question have certain values in these data elements. This information is immediately available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, on the VCS Bulletin Board.

Frequently a voter file will provide information on a survey respondent's political party. This is especially critical when the survey is for a Primary Election. If your candidate is running in a Democratic Primary, there is little value in asking Republicans how they feel about things. In Open Primary states, we may or may not have party data; but we do everything possible to capture it everywhere it is available.

Voter files frequently contain gender, birth date, registration date and lower level jurisdictions. VCS may add these, as well as ethnic code, homeowner coding and past absentee voter coding. Voter History, indicating which voters have voted in past elections, has become widely recognized as a key targeting variable for many campaign activities. VCS has a strong system for capturing and recording past voting behavior, and makes this data available on random samples, as well as for selections.

If lower level jurisdictions are important to your survey you might also want to consider the **R7) EXTENDED INFORMATION LIST, 21 FLAGS/JURIS**.

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Voters and Households and Phones

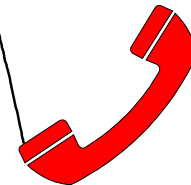
So far we have been talking about voters and voter's phone numbers, but phone numbers actually reach households, rather than individuals, and anyone can answer the phone. Not only might that person not be the voter you are seeking, they might not live there or they might be four years old.

But it is also possible that they do live there, and they are a registered voter. Possibly not the voter we would have listed if we took the first voter in the household, but still a voter that you could interview for your project. You can always ask the person who answers the phone if they are registered, but you won't know for sure if they are telling the truth. If you are capturing individual voter data from the voter file, you won't have their data. Because of these contingencies, many polling firms like to have all voters in the household listed rather than just the first one.

Under these circumstances, the cluster can be defined in terms of how many voters or how many households; but we recommend defining in terms of how many households. You still need a certain number of phone numbers to be sure of making a connection, regardless of how many individual voters are listed.

This option will work with any product. If you are using magnetic media files, the individual samples could have different numbers of voters if you defined the clusters in terms of a fixed number of households. In that case, you have to be sure that your vendor who is processing the magnetic media is careful to take this into account.

Either our Selective Voter List or our Extended Information List will work fine with this option. The next page, **R8) CLUSTER OF 10, ALL VOTERS IN HOUSEHOLD** shows a Selective Voter List with the "all voters in household" option. The page after that shows **R9) EXTENDED INFORMATION LIST, 21 FLAGS/JURIS**. With the Extended Information List, the "household line" with phone and address doesn't have to be repeated, so the list takes on a more compact form.



R8) CLUSTER OF 10, ALL VOTERS IN HOUSEHOLD

This is a regular "S" option Selective Voter List, like R2 and R3, but all voters in the household are listed. This gives access to individual data for every voter who might be reached.
